














A wide-ranging activist in cinema and the arts, Geralyn Dreyfous consults in the philanthropic sector, executive produces social documentaries, and participates on numerous boards and initiatives. In 2007, she co-founded Impact Partners Film Fund with Dan Cogan, a company that brings together financiers and socially conscious filmmakers. To date, IP has financed over fifty films, including three Academy Award winners and two nominees in the Best Documentary category, several Emmy Award winners, and numerous films that have screened internationally at major film festivals, including five at the Sundance Film Festival in



2014 alone. She also founded the Utah Film Center, a non-profit that curates free film screenings and outreach programs for communities throughout Utah. In 2013, the renowned International Documentary Association honored Dreyfous with the Amicus Award for her significant contributions to documentary filmmaking.
